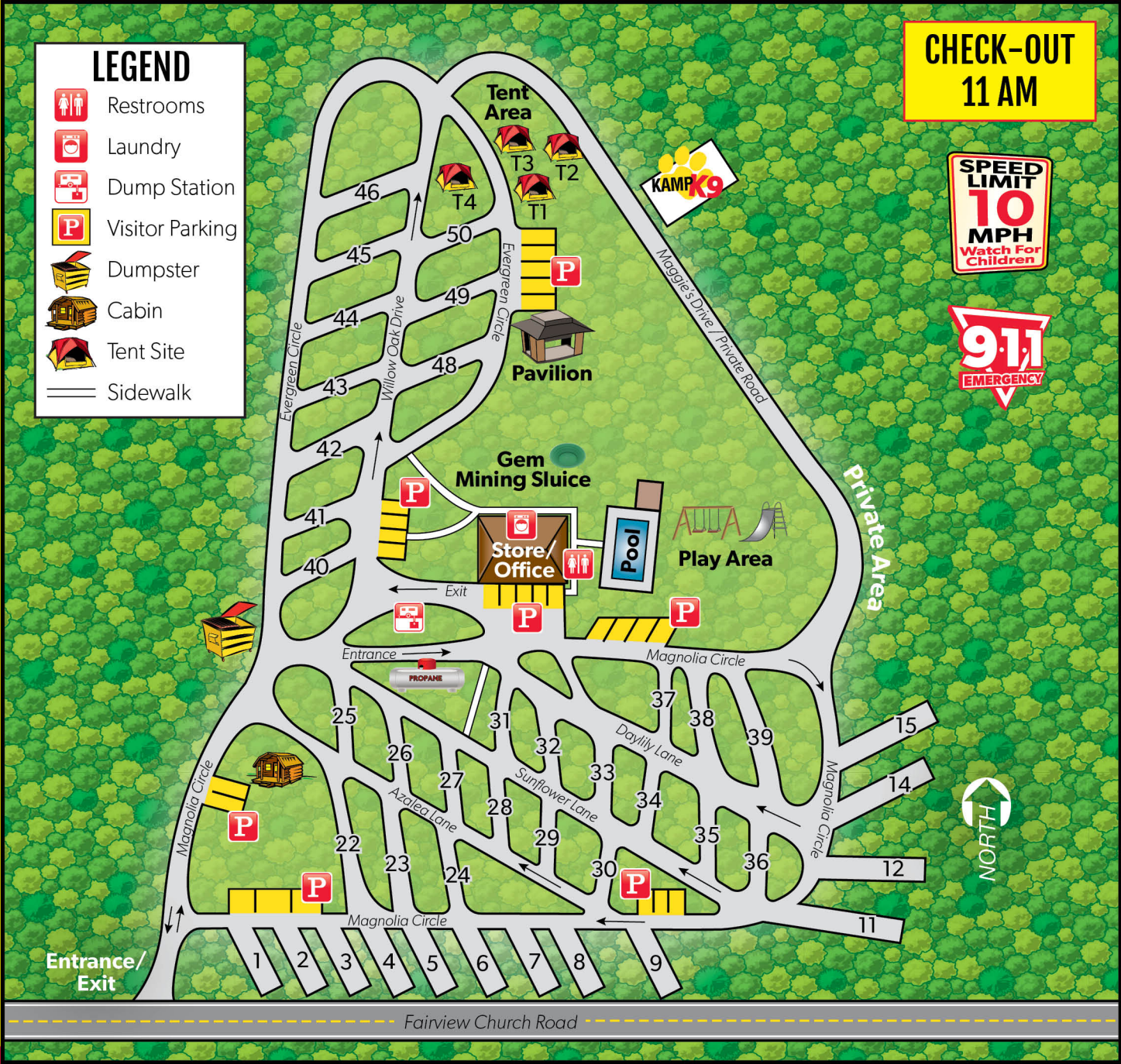

GUIDELINES FOR EVERYONE'S SAFETY & ENJOYMENT

Happy Camper Checklist

DO:

- Enjoy all the amenities of the campground.
- Accompany children, especially in the restroom, playground, camp store, and pool areas, at all times. You are responsible for the safety and actions of your kids.
- Dispose of your trash. There is a large dumpster on the exit road of the park.
- Help us keep our restrooms clean. Let us know if the restrooms need attention.
- Follow "camping etiquette" by respecting the space and property of your neighbors and their sites.
- Park on the graveled section of your campsite or in the designated "Visitor Parking" areas. Maximum of two vehicles per site.
- Keep sewer hoses attached to the sewer hook-ups provided on the site, especially when rinsing them prior to departure.
- Leash (8' or shorter), control, and clean up after your pets. "Doggy mitt" stations are located throughout the campground. We also offer them, free of charge, at the office.
- Observe the posted speed limit of 10 miles an hour. Watch for pedestrians, especially after dusk.
- Follow the "Quiet Hour" rule between 11 pm and 7 am.
- Swim at your own risk. There is no lifeguard on duty, so follow the posted pool rules.
- Wear proper swimming attire, including swim diapers for infants.
- Register all visitors with the office staff.
- Respect the land. Let all trees and plants grow undisturbed.
- Consult a staff member before driving a golf cart on campground property.

- Drink alcohol responsibly.
- Put your cigarette butts in the trash.
- Secure all belongings. The campground and its owners are not responsible for your stolen or damaged property.
- Inform all members of your party of these campground expectations.
- Ask a staff member for help or recommendations. We want you to have a pleasurable stay!

PLEASE DO NOT:

- Park on the grass.
- Place rugs on grass areas.
- Move fire rings or picnic tables.
- Hang clotheslines or tarps.
- Smoke in public areas: pool, restrooms, camp store, or laundry room.
- Throw cigarette butts on the ground.
- Bring pets into campground buildings.
- Use water hook-ups to rinse sewer hoses.
- Wash camping units or vehicles, without consent of management.
- Wash any dishes at a campsite or in the restrooms. This is a South Carolina law.
- Dive (head-first) into the pool.
- Run or rough house in the pool area or hang on the pool rope.
- Eat or drink in the pool.
- Ride ATVs on campground property.
- Ride bicycles after dusk.
- Leave pets outside and unattended anywhere in the campground.
- Use fireworks or discharge firearms.
